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OLSON: Good afternoon. My name is Renee Olson. I serve as the Administrator of the Employment Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation. I would like to call this meeting to order and welcome you to today's Listening Session in Fallon, regarding Employer Self-Service and Electronic Filing of Unemployment Insurance Contribution and Wage Reports.

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The purpose of this session is for us to hear your thoughts, ideas, and suggestions about the regulation that we are purposing to adopt next year. This will help us to craft effective and appropriate public policy that is well thought out and helps us improve the operations of the UI Program, and hopefully the customer service experience for our clients and customers. This regulation would require employers to submit quarterly Contribution and Wage reports electronically. Copies of the purposed regulations were posted to our website and we have provided copies here for your convenience.

I will be taking Agenda Item 6 out of order. Agenda Item 6 will proceed Item 5. In this order, you will first hear a brief explanation of the purposed regulation, and then we will be giving a demonstration of the system, tools, and options available to employers that will enable compliance with the purposed regulation.

Our Agenda today is extensive and we want to provide ample time to hear from you today. We have two opportunities for

public comment, one at the beginning of our meeting and the other at the end. Please allow us to work our way through the information we have prepared for you today, and then we will take all of your comments and recommendations into the record during the Public Comment periods indicated on the agenda. Please remember to silence your electronics, and use the microphone.

We are recording today's Listening Session and will transcribe the meeting so that we can accurately track and consider all information and comments we receive here today. We are happy to accept any written comments you wish to provide to staff. There are several sessions scheduled throughout the State and we welcome additional comments and suggestions at any time.

With that, I will move to Agenda Item No. 2, and open the meeting with the first session for public comment. Seeing no one approaching to make public comment, I will close Agenda Item No. 2, and move to Agenda Item No. 3, Confirmation of Posting. Mr. Markovic, was proper notice provided for this meeting pursuant to Nevada's Open Meeting Law, NRS241.020?

MARKOVIC: Marko Markovic for the record, Management Analysis with the Employment Security Division. Yes. The proper notice was provided pursuant to NRS241.020.

OLSON: Thank you. Under Agenda Item 4, Review of Written Comments. Mr. Markovic, were any written comments received? If so, please read them into the record.

MARKOVIC: Mark Markovic for the record. Again, no written comments have been received.

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OLSON: Okay. Thank you. We will now move on to Agenda Item 6, Discussion of the Purposed Regulation, and this will be presented by Mr. Jeffrey Frischmann.

FRISCHMANN: Good Morning. My name is Jeffrey

Frischmann, I am the Deputy Administrator for the Employment

Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and

Rehabilitation. In September of 2015, the UI Program implemented

the final phase for a new state-of-the-art computer system that

boasts a secured, user-friendly, self-service portal. Currently,

approximately 62 percent of Nevada employers are taking advantage

of the self-service portal and are regularly filing their

quarterly reports electronically. Approximately 81 percent of

the paper reports received are from employers with less than 10

employees. The purpose of the regulations is to mandate

electronic filing which will ultimately make the filing process

more efficient, cost effective, and improve accuracy.

In the three-years since implementing the new system, we have regularly received positive feedback from the 62 percent of employers that voluntarily file electronically. This is not unlike individuals that file their personal federal income tax returns electronically, where studies show that almost 75 percent of tax payers voluntarily elect to file their personal income tax returns online.

This approach is currently being used successfully in a number of states that have recently modernized their systems.

Those states have shifted staffing resources to focus on customer service to assist in educating employers on electronic filing, opposed to rekeying information from paper forms into the system. In the long term, it has benefited both the State and the employer community and has created a win-win situation for all of the stakeholders.

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The purposed regulation will not become effective until July of 2018, allowing sufficient time for employers that are not currently filing electronically to comply. The purposed regulation also allows for employers to request a waiver in instances where electronic filing could pose a hardship. We have included two additional topics for today's session, self-service registration and electronic payment of UI Contributions.

Although we have not drafted a regulation for either of these items, we're in the process of evaluating and analyzing the possibility of crafting a similar regulation to mandate employers to complete initial registration and pay through the self-service portal.

Currently, employers are permitted to register with UI

Contributions using a paper Registration Form. When the

Registration Form is received by the Division, staff are required

to manually enter the information into the system. Consideration

is being given to draft a future regulation requiring employers

to register online, effectively eliminating paper registration.

Approximately 78 percent of all monies collected by the Division is through an electronic transfer, either ACH Credit, or ACH Debit. Consideration is being given to draft a future regulation requiring employers to pay through an electronic transfer.

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While we are here to primarily focus on the purposed regulation to require electronic filing, if you have any initial thoughts regarding electronic payment or electronic registration, please feel free to share your thoughts. I would like to introduce Amy Yukish, she will provide a quick demonstration of the self-service portal and will file a Quarterly Report online. We will then ask for public comment. We decided to conduct this as a Listening Session rather than a question and answer, so that we can listen to what you, our customer, have to tell us.

OLSON: Thank you, Jeff. Amy, before you get started, to clarify the record, we are now moving back now to Agenda Item 5, Presentation of Unemployment Insurance Employer Self-Service.

YUKISH: Good afternoon. My name is Amy Yukish, I am a Business Process Analysis of the Employment Security

Division. Employer Self-Service Electronic Filing can be satisfied in one of three ways. Enter Report using UINV as manual data entry of the Contribution Report and Wage Report.

Electronic Filing W2—EFW2, is a file upload containing both the Contribution Report and Wage Report. Comma or tagged delaminated

files contain Wage Records only. If this file upload is performed, the Contribution Report will need to be entered using E-Filing Option, and to Report using UINV.

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As Jeff Frischmann mentioned, approximately 81 percent of employers filing paper returns have less than 10 employees. At this time, I would like to demonstrate the recommended E-Filing method for these employers, showing exactly how efficient and easy it is to submit to the Contribution and Wage Report through ESS.

I am now going to login. The Employer Summary alerts employers of all Contribution and Wage Reports due. going to file the first quarter of 2017 Report, using Enter Report, using UINV, and click search. I am in [Inaudible] and Contribution and Wage Reports, and click next. For any employee movement, you would simply select the employees who did not work for you during the quarter. I am going to delete three employees-or, select three employees and click, delete. For any new employees, you would click the Add Button, enter in the Social Security Number, last name, first name, and gross wages made during the quarter, and any tips. Once you have added all of the new employees, you would select, Add. You will now simply fill out the gross wages and tips for the remaining employees. am filling in gross wages for Employee 2, gross wages for Employee 3 and tips, gross wages for Employee 4, and gross wages for the last Employee. Once all of these records have been

entered, you would select, Next. Total gross wages and total taxable wages will be populated by the system based on the Wage Records just entered. Employers should validate these figures next to their records, and fill out how many employees per month in the quarter, and click, Next. The Employer will need to certify that all of the information is correct. It's in the form of an electronic signature. The Employer can also edit the Contribution Report or Wage Records from this page and click print. Once they are completed, they would hit, Submit. As you can see by the demonstration, E-filing method is user-friendly and can be completed in less than five minutes.

OLSON: Okay. Thank you, Amy. With that, we will close that Agenda Item and move on to the final closing Public Comment under Agenda Item No. 7. Seeing no one here to make public comment, with that, I will close that Agenda Item, close Public Comment. I would like to thank everyone who participated today.
