STATE OF NEVADA EMPLOYMENT SECURITY DIVISION (ESD) WORKSHOP TO ADDRESS THE IMPACT OF PROPOSED REGULATION ON SMALL BUSINESS

Monday, October 30, 2023

I. <u>CALL TO ORDER AND WELCOME</u>

Administrator Kristine Nelson identified herself as the administrator for Nevada Employment Security Division, opening today's agenda and welcomed everyone to today's Small Business Workshop. After reading NRS 233B.0608 to inform everyone for the purpose of soliciting public comments, she then moved on to Agenda Item 2.

II. <u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u>

Administrator Nelson moved on to Agenda Item II and opened the floor for any public comments from those in Carson City.

Lindsay Thompson, DETR/MASS, MAIV confirmed that there was no one available to make public comments at this time in person.

C. <u>Review of NAC regulation 612.270</u>

On October 4th, 2023, the Employment Security Council convened in public meeting and reviewed data presented by DETR staff, which was reiterated here today in these presentations you've just heard. After consideration, the Council then voted upon and approved its recommendation to maintain the average tax rate of 1.65% for the calendar year 2024.

In addition, pursuant to NRS 612.606, Nevada employers are required to contribute an additional 0.05%, which is paid into the Unemployment Compensation Administration Fund that administers the Career Enhancement Program in this State.

By maintaining this current average tax contribution rate pursuant to this regulation amendment – Nevada employers' wages will not be subject to the automatic 3.00%, which is the rate that would be in effect in the absence of this regulation amendment.

Under a separate statutory provision in Nevada's unemployment compensation law - NRS 612.350 - the total wages subject to UI contributions rose from \$40,100 in 2023 to \$40,600 in 2024. Without this regulation, the maximum cost per employee would rise to \$1,197.70. Under this regulation, the maximum cost per employee at the average rate of 1.65% will be \$669.90, a per-employee savings of approximately \$525 compared to the rate that would go into effect in the absence of this regulation.

VI. <u>WORKSHOP TO CONSIDER PROPOSED REGULATIONS REVISIONS IN NAC</u> <u>CHAPTERS 612 AND NAC 394.</u>

Administrator Nelson opened Agenda Item 6 by informing everyone that there are five (5) parts to Agenda Item 6.

- A. Amendment/Clarification to NAC 612.120, 612.290, 612.470, and 612.660 (Amendment/Clarification): To add electronically transmitted to the stated regulations.
- **B.** Removal of NAC 612.590 through 612.625: Proposing consideration of the removal of these 15 regulations related to the relic/unnecessary unemployment compensation bond fund.
- C. Removal/cleanup of NAC 612.056: Proposing consideration of the removal of this regulation as it is contrary to current statute to-wit: NRS 612.265.
- D. Removal of NAC 394.700 through NAC 394.730: Proposing consideration of the removal of these six (6) regulations related to the Alcoholic Beverage Awareness Program (NAC 394.700 through NAC 394.730). These regulations are invalid to the authorities provided by law to CPE and are recommended for removal.
- **E.** Removal of NAC 394.600: Proposing consideration of the removal of this regulation as it is burdensome to licensed institutions.
- **F.** Opened floor for any public questions.
