Nevada adds jobs back in July; Unemployment rate declines

CARSON CITY, NV - According to the Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation's (DETR) July 2021 economic report, Nevada added back 4,800 jobs over the month as the state continues to recover. The number of jobs remain below typical levels, but are up 100,900 since July 2020, an annual increase of 8.2%. The large increase of employment over the year reflects the significant effects the pandemic had on employment last year. The total employment level in the state is 1,335,900. The State's unemployment rate in July is 7.7 percent, down slightly from 7.8 percent in June and down 8.9 percentage points when compared to the unemployment rate of 16.6 percent in July 2020.

Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) Employment (*Seasonally Adjusted):

- Las Vegas employment increased by 6,500 jobs (0.7%) since June, an increase of 72,200 jobs (8.2%) since July 2020.
- Reno employment had an increase of 500 jobs (0.2%) since June, an increase of 15,700 jobs (6.8%) since July 2020.
- Carson City employment had an increase of 100 jobs (0.3%) since June, an increase of 1,100 jobs (3.7%) since July 2020.

"Nevada continues to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. July data provides us with a better look at the pace of this recovery since the state fully relaxed business restrictions in June. While some industries have exceeded their pre-recession peak employment, others remain significantly lower. Most notably, the casino hotel industry remains down roughly 67,000 jobs from its prerecession peak and is just 62 percent recovered while food services is 97 percent recovered and retail trade employment is 100 percent recovered. The State's unemployment rate dropped slightly to 7.7 percent this month. While July data is positive, there is still significant disruption to the economy as businesses and labor force seek to recover from the effects of the pandemic," said David Schmidt, Chief Economist.

* Seasonally adjusted estimates remove the effect of normal economic patterns from month to month; the rest of the estimates in this release have not been seasonally adjusted.

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Nevada Statewide & Metro Area Labor Market Overview

As we enter the second half of 2021, we see that Nevada continues to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic. July represents the second month since the state fully relaxed business restrictions and showed that most industries in the state are continuing to grow. Total employment in the state rose by 4,800 jobs since June, over 100,000 jobs higher than this same month last year. This represents a slower pace of growth compared to June. Nevada has currently recovered around 68 percent of the jobs lost during the recession, leaving state employment just short of 92 percent of its prerecession peak.

Most industries in Nevada grew in July with the largest growth in the leisure and hospitality as well as professional and business services sectors. Job growth in Leisure and hospitality added 1,800 workers or 0.7 percent (SA). Both accommodation and food service contribute to this growth with this sector. Professional and business services added 1,500 jobs over the month, gorwing at a rate of 0.8 percent. Although most industries in the state continue to recover, a few industries lost employment in July, most notably construction which was down by 1,000 jobs or 1.1 percent.

All three of the state's metropolitan areas (MSA) experienced growth in July. The Las Vegas MSA added 6,500 jobs, growing at 0.7 percent. The Reno MSA grew by 500 jobs or 0.2 percent while the Carson City area grew by 100 jobs or 0.3 percent.

The State's unemployment rate dropped to 7.7 percent this month. This is a slight improvement over 7.8 percent in June and down from 16.6 percent in July 2020.

Although both the employment growth and unemployment rate trends are positive, there are still significant hurdles in achieving a full recovery in the state, especially the uncertainty around new COVID-19 variants and their potential impacts on businesses and the labor force.







Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)

Figures for our unemployment estimates come from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program sponsored by the (<u>BLS</u>). Nevada's unemployment rate was 7.7 percent in July 2021, decreasing from 7.8 percent in June 2021, and down from 16.6 percent in July 2020, seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals decreased by 458 since June 2021 for a current level of 121,664 people, which is 129,375 less unemployed people then July 2020. The labor force in Nevada is currently 1,577,618 people, which is 8,457 more people than June 2021, and is up 65,030 people since July 2020.




Unemployment State Rankings (Prior Month's Data)

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Connecticut and New Mexico had the highest unemployment rate in June, 7.9 percent, followed by Nevada, 7.8 percent, and New York California and Hawaii, 7.7 percent each. Nebraska had the lowest rate, 2.5 percent followed by Utah, 2.7 percent.




Employment State Rankings (Prior Month's Data)

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Nevada experienced the largest over-the-year percentage increase in non-farm payrolls in June 2021, up by 11.6 percent, followed by New Jersey at 9.8 percent. The smallest over-the-year employment increased was seen in Oklahoma which grew by 2.1 percent.




Employment growth (y/y) June 2021

Unemployment Insurance


In July, 9,796 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed in Nevada, a decrease of 452 claims, or 4.4 percent, from June when there were 10,248 claims. July's total follows a seasonal trend of declining initial claims in the spring and summer months. However, due to the considerable labor market impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and the recent increase of COVID-19 cases, as result of the Delta Variant spread, it is hard to be sure if our typical seasonal trends will hold true. While the initial claims totals are certainly better than they were a year ago, uncertainly persists in the months to come.



Claims activity for Nevada's regular program saw decreases across most measures in July, a reflection of the decline in initial claims seen over the last five months. The number of regular program weeks claimed and compensated decreased from June, resulting in \$48.7 million in benefit payments, a decrease of 25.3 percent from the previous month. First payments were also down over the month, likely related to the initial claims decreases seen in the recent months. Final payments, also known as benefit exhaustions, increased to 4,831, a decline of 12.1 percent from June.

Beginning borrowing in December, Nevada's Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund borrowed over \$330 million through April to fund benefits in Nevada. In early August, the state will receive UI tax contributions for the third quarter of 2021 which will help fund benefits for the next two months. Before the end of the quarter, funds appropriated by the Legislature will be applied to repay these loans, which will shift the trust fund back into a net-positive cash position.

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
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CES Summary Tables


